IMPACT REPORT 2021

2020 and 2021 were two years when the world appeared to stand still, paralysed by the Covid pandemic. It was no different for us as a mission agency both for our operations in the UK and in the field.

Our members, partners and associate members all needed to find different ways to enable the work to continue in their projects. Until February 2021, Cambodia had escaped relatively lightly with recorded Covid cases very low. However, as with many countries, that all changed with increasing infections and sadly fatalities.

However, despite all that has gone on, this report will give you a brief glimpse of the impact made over that difficult period. 2021 was a challenging year but also a fruitful one and we agree with what the Psalmist wrote in Psalms 46:8

'Look what the Lord has done ...'

Ministry to men

- 20 visits to church-based men's groups and young factory worker groups

Student training

- 70 students trained in English, Maths, Computing and Life Skills

Families with HIV

- 33 families with HIV received 396 food parcels
- 45 children educated and supplied with school materials

Orphans and Vulnerable Children

- 47 Children received food parcels, hygiene packs, household supplies, special food and emergency help.



Bible classes

- 707 classes in prisons
- 30 church-based students fortnightly

Children who were in care

- 18 Children in emergency foster care received 47 visits
- 45 children reintegrated into their families
